The Bottom Line

Medi-Cal was launched by Veterinary Medical Diets (VMD) in October 1990 by three veterinarians and a Ph D. nutritionist. Their state of the art production facility is located in Guelph, Ontario.

Why buy a diet from your veterinarian when the Royal Canin brand of food is available in the pet stores? The diets offered in the pet stores are completely different formulations than the ones offered in veterinary clinics.

As we're sure most of you have noticed our food shelves are looking a little different lately (and we don't just mean the new glass doors to keep Tux out). We have always carried the veterinary exclusive line of diets made by a Canadian company called Medi-Cal. Medi-Cal has always been a high quality diet that many veterinarians trust and recommend to their clients. A few years ago, the company was purchased by Royal Canin, another well known name in the pet food industry.

Medi-Cal has always believed in what they call the 'Circle of Health'. This means that for the optimum health and well-being of our pets to occur there must be an integral relationship between nutrition, veterinary care and exercise. While Royal Canin has recently changed the name and packaging of Medi-Cal diets, they continue to believe in the 'Circle of Health' and will continue to market Medi-Cal / Royal Canin Veterinary Diet brands exclusively through veterinary clinics. This is because they realize that veterinarians and their staff are the best source of information regarding all three areas of the 'Circle of Health'. The diets are designed for optimum health through different life stages, and for the treatment and prevention of specific medical conditions and disease states.

Many of you may ask, why buy a diet from your veterinarian when the Royal Canin brand of food is available in the pet stores? The diets offered in the pet stores are completely different formulations than the ones offered in veterinary clinics. The diets offered in veterinary clinics fall into two categories, therapeutic and life stage. The therapeutic formulas are produced to address very specific health conditions and disease states; using food as medicine. The life stage formulas are designed to meet the nutritional needs of healthy animals. Both diets undergo extensive research and clinical trials to ensure efficacy and safety. They rely on the veterinarian to assess the needs of the individual and choose the most appropriate formula. In the veterinary clinic, the veterinary team are specialists on animal health and nutrition.

We have an established relationship with you and your pets which allows us to have a complete understanding of your pet's needs and lifestyle. We also have an educated knowledge about food and nutrition. We can best assess the unique needs of your individual pets based on multiple factors such as weight, body condition score, dental and joint health, skin and coat condition, and any previous existing medical concerns. From this, we can determine the very specific nutritional requirements of each individual pet and recommend a veterinary exclusive formula that is targeted to the specific needs of that individual. As experts, we can explain the benefits of the formula we are recommending and provide reasons for our recommendations.

The Bottom Line

The term "meal" simply refers to a ground material. Royal Canin's chicken meal is cooked, dehydrated & comprised of ground chicken meat, skin (for Omega Fatty Acids) and bone (for calcium). Chicken meal has a fine flour like consistency and is a highly digestible protein source.



Corn is not a filler as people often believe. It is a very nutritious and digestible ingredient. High quality corn that is finely ground provides energy, proteins, omega-6 fatty acids, vitamins, minerals, and anti-oxidants.

One of the main advantages of a diet like Medi-Cal/Royal Canin is that they stay current with the newest scientific research in nutrition. So from time to time there will be changes or upgrades in the formulas. The diets that you have known and are familiar with have been recently modified to be more accommodating and beneficial to your pets at all life stages, and for pets of all shapes and sizes. Rest assured, the diets continue to maintain the high quality ingredients and nutritional benefits that you are used to. All of the diets have been enhanced with a special patented antioxidant blend that helps protect against free radical damage, as well as highly digestible nutrients that decrease feeding volume and stool quantity. The diets also include special digestive support that protect the gastrointestinal tract and decrease the likelihood of vomiting and diarrhea. Each new diet has been formulated to address all of the specific needs of your pets from the young large breed dog to the tiny senior cat.



Some of these improvements include:

- * Increased glucosamine and chondroitin levels have been added to the large dog diets to prevent joint damage.
- * Kibble size, density, shape and texture have been adapted to the smaller mouth and jaw of small dogs in the small dog diets.
- * Supplemental levels of DHA (an omega-3 fatty acid) have been added to the puppy and kitten formulas to contribute to brain and nervous tissue development for puppies and kittens.
- * High water binding capacity fibres have been added to the weight control diets to help contribute to the feeling of fullness so overweight pets will want to eat less.
- * Supplemental green tea phenols to support oral health have been added to the dental diets.
- * Supplemental levels of EPA/DHA, leucine, glucosamine and chondroitin, L-carnitine, and many other nutrients have been added to the mature diets of both dogs and cats to help provide optimal protein, energy and nutrient levels for our aging pets.

All of the diets are made using high quality ingredients. The sourcing and testing of all ingredients go through stringent quality control and utilize very specific safety parameters. The veterinary exclusive diets all have a very unique formulation. The scientific research involved in each diet focuses on the nutritional aspect of disease prevention and treatment. Combine this with an assessment of your pet by your veterinarian, then a proper diet recommendation can be made for your pet. As you can see, ideal nutrition is not a simple decision!



As well as the formulas being changed, the names of the diets have also changed. This was done to help be more specific to each pet's needs and lifestyle.

The Bottom Line

Pet food is best fed within one month of opening the bag but can be used for up to a few months. For optimum freshness you can freeze the dry food in an air tight container.

All Medi-Cal/Royal Canin diets are guaranteed for palatability. If you purchase a bag and your pet does not eat it, you can simply bring the bag back for a full refund.
